- Science Research (including, but not limited to cancer, genetics, substance abuse, and Alzheimer's)

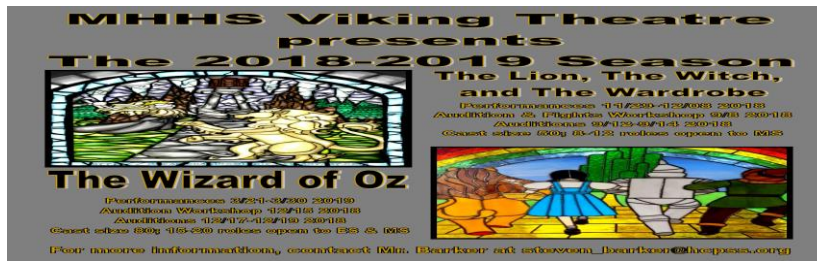
