



Welcome to MTH Math!

- All students must take 4 years of math. You may take more than 4 courses over the 4 years, but you must take at least one math class each year.
 - 2 MCAP Assessed courses: Algebra 1 and Algebra 2. A passing score of the Algebra 1 MCAP is a graduation requirement. The Algebra 2 MCAP is a measure of College and Career Readiness.
- Students are encouraged to have their own handheld TI-84+ Calculator. This tool will be used in every Math, and some Science courses, over the duration of high school and beyond.
- Algebra 1, Geometry, and Algebra 2 courses offer an additional support course called Seminar. This course is an elective credit and student would take it concurrently with the course.

World Languages

- Incoming 9th graders will receive credit for Spanish 1 or French 1 if they:
 - Pass all years of the course + Pass the end-of-course assessment = 1 high school credit, but the grade will not be factored into their GPA
- Some incoming 9th graders will also receive credit for Spanish 2 or French 2 coming from EMMS or DMS
- Students who have not started a language or want to start a new one can choose from:
 - German
 - Spanish
 - French (currently only levels 2-4)

World Languages

- Keep going! Many colleges are looking for 3+ years
- Although other languages are listed in the course catalogue, their offering is based on student enrolment and finding a highly-qualified teacher
- 2 language credits are required for high school graduation, but there are 2 other options*:
 - Advanced Technology Education Sequence
