Happy Friday, Vikings!

We had another great week virtually! The third quarter closes today, and Monday we begin quarter four – time certainly is moving fast now that we're "back together." The last day for seniors is May 20 and hopefully we will have more information about the rest of the year soon. In the meantime, we want to keep sharing our good news, celebrating our students and acknowledging all of the special traditions we have this time of year.

Ramadan Mubarak! This week Ramadan begins for our Muslim families. Ramadan is the most sacred month of the year for Muslims. This year, Ramadan is anticipated to begin at sunset on Thursday April 23rd and last through Saturday May 23rd. In most Arab nations, the first day of fasting for the holy month of Ramadan is determined by the sighting of the new moon. The first day of fasting is expected to be on Friday, April 24th. Muslims fast every day from dawn to sunset. It is meant to be a time of spiritual discipline, of deep contemplation of one's faith. Over the next month, our Muslim community will be fasting, engaging in various forms of prayer and celebrating Eid al Fitr at the end of Ramadan to the extent that the pandemic allows.

After two weeks of #Suitup, shaving heads and posting MHHS lacrosse pictures and videos, the CHS and MHHS communities have raised over \$50,000! THANK YOU to all of the coaches, players, staff, alumni and community members who helped us reach this unimaginable milestone! Our community clearly knows how to take care of one another! We have also provided many of our students and families in need with gift cards and Chromebooks which were shipped to homes this week.

This past Wednesday was Earth Day! And to help us celebrate the 50th anniversary of this environmental movement as well as the 30th Anniversary of the Howard County Conservancy, students from across the county participated in the Virtual Watershed Summit. **Natalie Booth** and **Nidhi Anne** represented Mt. Hebron's 9th grade GT Biology and Earth Science students and shared the research they conducted last fall.

In addition, they provided recommendations to improve our watershed based on data collected at a stream site as well as from our own school yard. Governor Rutherford, Dr. Martirano, Dr. Ball, Senator Sarbanes, Christiana Rigby, Deb Jung, and Ava Marie (WBAL Channel 11). Student Device Update

Following on-site distribution of student technology devices to high school students, the challenges of adhering to social distancing guidelines proved too difficult to continue distribution at schools. Devices are being sent via FedEx to families of elementary and middle school students who have requested to borrow them, as well as any high school students who have not yet received a requested device.

Unfortunately, FedEx backlogs have delayed delivery of some devices for students. In error, parents may have received an email regarding the assignment of a Chromebook that they have not yet received.

To better assist families, parents/guardians can view devices assigned to students in HCPSS Connect. To see these devices, parents/guardians should <u>log in to HCPSS</u> <u>Connect</u>, select Student Technology on the left navigation bar and then again in the middle. A new window will open where families can see devices assigned and indicate any changes to their needs. <u>Full</u> <u>directions</u> are available online.



If the device(s) listed in the inventory section are not received by Friday, April 24, parents/guardians are asked to email the Information Technology Asset Management team at ITAM@hcpss.org. Make sure to include your child's legal name, student identification number (if known), and any other relevant information.

 - A sample script when calling admissions or financial aid officers: "Hello my name is NAME and I've been accepted to your school. NAME OF SCHOOL is my top choice and I would love to attend. The only thing holding me back is the financial aid offer. Do you have a process to appeal financial aid offers?" Make sure you are pleasant and professional because they are the ones who make the final decisions. Also make sure you follow the process exactly as any deviation could mean you do not get more money. If this is true, you may add this but DO NOT LIE! "The only thing holding me back is that OTHER SCHOOL has offered me a full scholarship/more scholarship and I was wondering if NAME OF SCHOOL could meet OTHER SCHOOL's offer?"

AP Exam Updates

College Board has provided some additional information about the upcoming Advanced Placement (AP) spring exams. Below are a few critical points for parents and students:

• Exam Format

 Each AP exam will generally be a 45-minute, open book/open note, online assessment that will cover the first 75% of the course. Students will be able to access the exam using a variety of devices. The schedule and specifics on each exam are on the <u>College Board's</u> <u>COVID website</u>. More details about accessing the assessments will be released later in the month.

- Cancellations
 - Students do not need to officially cancel exams. Students can decide the day of the exam not to sit for the exam. Before deciding not to sit, we recommend that students work with their teachers and the optional College Board online resources to determine their preparedness.
- Refunds
 - Any student who does not take the exam will be provided a full refund by HCPSS. In late June, College Board will confirm who has taken exams and our school will begin processing refunds for any student who did not participate.
