News from the Health Room: How to Stay Well

Immune system helpers:

- Eat a well-balanced diet
- Get adequate sleep (The National Sleep Foundation recommends 8.5-9.25 hours a sleep each night for teenagers).
- Manage Stress
- Exercise (Kidshealth.org & the CDC recommend one hour of physical activity each day).

Hygiene helpers:

- Wash hands well and frequently (20 seconds with warm running water and soap).
- Avoid touching eyes ,nose, and mouth
- Cover sneezes and coughs with a tissue then wash your hands.
- Do not share food/drinks or personal items.

Mrs. Im also serves as the Vice President for Howard County's Special Education Citizens' Advisory Committee (SECAC).

There will be 4 meetings held throughout the school year from 6:30-8:30 in the school's media center. Topics include:

Thursday, November 1, 2018 - The Big Picture: What is Level 8

Group discussion will provide parents with a lens to assess their student's social skill ability. Parents will learn about the 10 Levels to Living Independently and how to foster these essential independence skills before venturing out on their own.

Wednesday, January 16, 2019 - Beyond ESY

Group discussion is designed to help parents understand the importance of expanding their high school student's social experiences to include real world opportunities across multiple settings.

Monday, February 11, 2019 - Benefits of Building Partnerships and Social Success Group will review and discuss models of parent professional partnership, include a guide towards building successful partnerships with school staff and setting realistic expectations for lifelong learning.

Wednesday, May 8, 2019 - SI + SR = €

Group discussion designed to foster an understanding of the relationship between social interaction and self-regulation; to prompt parents to implement strategies at home.
