Program Description: Smart Cents Fall Teen Camp - a personal finance workshop for youth ages 12-15. The overall goal is to increase the ability of young people to make informed decisions about financial wellness while strengthening their use of social and emotional skills necessary for success as they grow into responsible adults. Topics covered include financial decision making, spending and saving, debt and credit, careers, and risk management. <u>Free</u> vaccine clinics will be held at several HCPSS schools every day from 4-6 p.m. during the week of September 21-25. Clinics will be held outdoors using a virtual queue program so families can wait in their cars or socially distance from the clinic. Appointments can be made at any available location.
