- It is not too late to register for the December 7 SAT! The LATE REGISTRATION DEADLINE is NOVEMBER 26.

#### A Note from the Nurse

As we enter into flu season, this is a reminder that good hand washing and covering sneezes and coughs with tissues and sleeves are essential steps to preventing the spread of "germs." Also, remember that despite concerns about school attendance, your children's health (and the health of other children) is most important of all. For this reason, we ask you to please:

- <u>Call the school nurse to let us know if your child is absent with a contagious illness such</u> <u>as strep throat, or the flu etc.</u> Please provide any documentation from your physician about diagnosis and release to return to school. (Ear and sinus infections, while often a reason for keeping a child home, are usually not contagious.)
- Keep your child home if he/she has a fever of over 100.0. A fever indicates that your child has an infection that could be passed to other students. If you give your child Motrin or Tylenol, the fever will, of course, disappear but he/she will still be contagious to others. <u>Children must be fever-free for 24 hours (without medication) before returning to school!</u>
- <u>Have your children wash their hands properly after using the restrooms and prior to eating.</u>
- If the doctor prescribes medication for your child, please make sure he/she takes it as <u>directed</u>-which means the right amount at the right time and without missing doses.

She will be available by appointment on Mondays beginning Oct. 7th in Student Services office between 9am-1:00pm (last appointment). There is limited space so please do not delay. Please contact Ms. Linda Mathias in Student Services, to schedule an appointment. You are encouraged to bring any pertinent financial statements.

We hope that coming onsite to your school is helpful for your students and families, and will encourage early completion of the FAFSA to maximize your student's financial aid opportunity.

Students/parents should bring the following information with them:

- a. The student/parents FSA ID, if they already have one.
- b. The student/parents social security number
- c. A copy of the student and/or the parents <u>2018 Tax Returns</u>, if they have filed taxes.
- d. A copy of the student and/or parents 2018 W2's and,
- e. All <u>2018 untaxed income information</u>. Untaxed information includes but is not limited to child support paid or received, housing, food, and other living allowances, veterans non-educational benefits, etc.

Registration for AP exams closed on November 15<sup>th</sup> at 2:30pm. If a student wishes to register after November 15<sup>th</sup>, he/she may see Dr. Kiehl in room 109. College Board charges a late fee of \$40 per exam, on top of the \$94 exam fee. Students who registered for exams but wish to cancel will be charged a \$40 cancellation fee from College Board, meaning their refund will be \$54. These students should also see Dr. Kiehl. Registration closes for late orders or cancellations on March 13<sup>th</sup>.
