CR-112- 2019	UPDATE: A RESOLUTION directing the establishment of a Task Force comprised of community stakeholders to examine housing policy and socioeconomic factors that impact student achievement in Howard County Public Schools	PASSED	This resolution was significantly watered down in wording but seeks to address the achievement gap through a Task Force to look at factors impacting the achievement versus putting solely at the feet of HCPSS
CB-42- 2019	AN ACT to alter the school facilities surcharge in accordance with Chapter 744 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2019; and generally relating to the school facilities surcharge.	ON HOLD Written testimony: councilmail@howa rdcountymd.gov.	This bill sets the new Facilities surcharge from \$1.32 to \$6.80 (with some exceptions). Developers came out in force and the whole board voted to seek out more accurate information before bringing to a vote.

HCPSS Boundary Review aka "Redistricting"- Written Testimony Welcome

All of the HCPSS information on redistricting can be found here: <u>HCPSS Redistricting</u>. Scroll down the timeline to August 22 where you will find <u>the Superintendant's Recommended Plan</u>. This explains Dr. Martirano's goals and method for moving over 7,400 Howard County students, <u>167 of whom are from Mt. Hebron</u>. <u>Do you have an opinion? Provide Written Testimony</u>: Until 4:30 p.m. on November 19, the Board of Education will <u>receive written testimony</u> via USPS mail or emailing it to <u>redistricting@hcpss.org</u>. It is highly recommended that testimony be sent as an attachment. Testimony sent to individual Board members or to the BOE email address will not be accepted. <u>What is PTSA</u> <u>Doing?</u> PTSA members approved a position statement at the 9/10/19 meeting saying that redistricting at the high school level, for Mt. Hebron and the county, should be postponed until after the attendance area for the new High School #13 is confirmed. Read the entire statement on the PTSA website homepage blog dated 9/11/2019 <u>http://www.mthebronptsa.com/</u>. PTSA provided oral testimony at the Sept. 17 BOE hearing. Email <u>mthebronptsa@gmail.com</u> with any questions. <u>Decision Time</u>: The Board of Education (BOE) will vote on a plan on November 21, 2019 to implement in the 2020-2021 school year.

Driver's Education:



Greg's Driving School is the largest driving school in Maryland and has been supporting the Viking Backers and Mount Hebron students since 2006. We provide the 36-hour Driver's Education program directly after school. Any student in Maryland who is 15 years of age or older is eligible to take the classroom portion, and once they are 15 years and 9 months of age they can take the behind-the-wheel part of the program. The program runs for ten (10) days, usually consecutive except for days that school is not in session. Students can sign up for classes at Mount Hebron by visiting www.gregsmd.com/MHHS. Parents may view our <u>Online Parent Orientation</u> to learn what to expect from the Greg's Driver Education Program and how to assist us in helping your new driver take this important step toward adulthood. As parents are part of the equation in shaping new drivers, your role is important in keeping them safe.

Another useful resource is the free <u>RoadReady</u> app which has been approved by the Maryland Motor Vehicle Administration. This app helps you record the 60 hours of home driving practice that is required of your student, an essential step in the student's progress through the Graduated Licensing System. The app is free and can be downloaded at www.roadreadyapp.com.
